Collect of the Day

Omitted

Great Litany

On the first and fifth Sundays in Lent the Great Litany shall be sung or said after the Prayer of Humble Access. On these days the Decalogue, Confession of Sin, and Absolution are omitted and the liturgy continues with the Lenten Hymn. Furthermore the Prayers of the Faithful are omitted on days when the Great Litany is prayed. Thus Liturgy of the Word ends with the Concluding Collect.

The Concluding Collect

Presider: O Lord our God, You uphold the cause of the oppressed and give food to the hungry. You set prisoners free and give sight to the blind: Help us to act like You, to lift up those who are bowed down, through Jesus Christ the Lord. *Amen.*
